## Budget 2016/17: Notes

- 1. CPI 1.7% applied on 2016/17 where appropriate.
- 2. All figures for 2016/17 exlude GST, noting that some don't attract GST.
- 3. Additional Sources of Income which may not appear in the Budget:
- A. Ecumenical Lenten Studies Funds:

In 2012 LOCCSA agreed to transfer \$68,895.53 to SACC from accrued Ecumenical Lenten Studies funds, subject to the following arrangements:

- "i. Interest to be apportioned annually 1/3rd to LoCCSA for LoCCSA Activities , 2/3rd to SACC for ecumenical resourcing .
- ii. Up to 10% of Capital to be allocated to SACC Budget each year for ecumenical resourcing.

Reference LOCCSA Minutes: 5/10/2012.

Capital is held in a Term Deposit and shown on the Balance Sheet. Therefore, it is not included in the Budget as it has already been received as Income, for use each year for ecumenical resourcing. *Reference: advice from Auditor Geoff Davis, August 2015.*Ecumenical Resourcing includes a contribution towards specific projects such as Receptive Ecumenism and associated costs such as printing and hospitality.

### B. St Paul's City Ministry

In 2012, SACC received \$9,000 in wind-up of SPCM. Executive Committee agreed that:

- i. Up to \$1,500 be allocated each year to a work in the name of SPCM.
- ii. The capital from SPCM be invested to generate some interest which would be added to an amount from the capital each year to bring total up to \$1,500.

(This would enable an event to be held each year for approximately 8 years.) Reference Executive Minutes 14/3/2012.

Capital shown previously at SPCM is not to be included in the Budget as it has already been received as Income. This Income is held in a Term Deposit for use each year as described. *Reference: advice from Auditor, Geoff Davis, August 2015.* 

#### C. Shares Dividends

SACC receives as income the twice yearly dividend. On occasion, however, it may be more prudent to reinvest in shares holding. When reinvestment occurs, that amount is shown in the balance sheet as an increase under Shares in Public Companies, rather than as Income.
